## 1 Availability of data

1.1 OSG paper 3 provides detailed coverage of statistics published by the Department for education (DfE) and Office for National Statistics (ONS) on 18 October 2018. This paper supplements that report by providing the Comparative NEET Scorecard for December 2018.

## 2 NEET and Not Known Scorecard

- 2.1 The summary of each borough's position in the Comparative NEET Scorecard for December 2018 is shown in figure 1. The RAG Rating relates to boroughs' position in the national league table and is divided into quintiles.
- 2.2 Please note that this information is not published by ONS or DfE and should be used with caution.
- 2.3 You will be aware that NEET and activity not known statistics are subject to distortion over the summer vacation and in the first term of each academic year. We do not therefore provide an analysis of NEET figures during the period covering August to November each year.
- 2.4 The overall proportion of young people who were NEET in December 2018 was 1.6%. In comparison, the figure for December 2017 was 1.8%.
- 2.5 The overall proportion of young people whose activity status was not known to their local authority was 4.2% in December 2018 (4.2% in December 2017).
